LESSON 1 - Events Leading to the Populating of the Americas

Objectives:

- Describe the importance of historiography, which includes how historical knowledge is obtained and transmitted, when interpreting events in history.
- Use research and inquiry skills to analyze American history using primary and secondary sources.
- Understand and explain how the Americas were populated
- Understand and explain how events in one region of the world affect other regions of the world.

Connections Thinking Guide: As you explore this lesson, think about how events in one region of the world influenced the events in other regions of the world.

During the last Ice Age, ocean water froze and became glaciers. These glaciers were responsible for lowering seas levels and creating a bridge of frozen land between Asia and Alaska, now called the Bering Strait. As far back as 40,000 years ago, people first crossed that bridge and traveled from Asia to the Americas. The Ice Age ended about 30,000 years later, melting the glaciers which caused sea levels to rise and flood the Bering Strait. The changing climates meant the land could no longer support large animals, and they began to disappear. People adapted by starting to hunt smaller animals and explore alternative food options. Soon food supplies were found by fishing and gathering nuts and berries. Over time, mass migration would have people settling North, Central and South America.

Helpful Tip: The actual screen view is larger than this. However, if you want to enlarge the online screen view, hold the control key down and press the + key on your computer keyboard and the screen view will enlarge. Need it larger? Repeat the process.

The **'Lesson Review'** follows the lesson, usually on the same screen view.

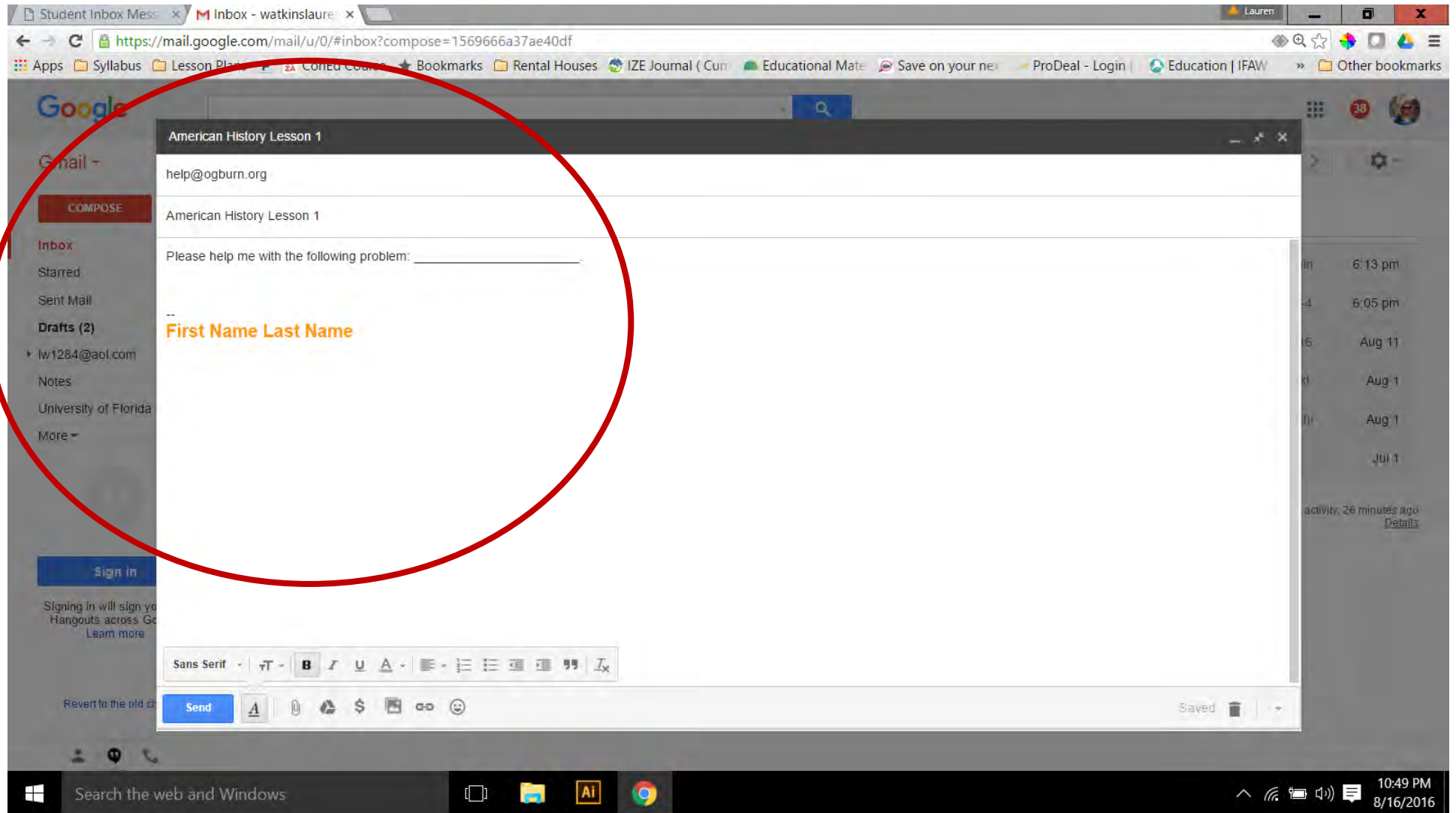
